

ARBORICULTURE TECHNIQUES

Description: The objective of this event is to evaluate the skills and knowledge of the participants on general and accepted arboricultural practices. The competition is intended to be competitive and educational for all students, regardless of their skill level.

The competition is split up into three areas: Knowledge Exam, Climbing Skills, and Throw Line Skills. A two-person team will perform the three areas, with each team member taking the exam, and then one team member performing the climbing skills, while the other team member performs the throw line skills part of the event. *[A back up event (knot tying) will be conducted concurrently with the Climbing Skills if there is a forecast of possible rain. Should all or a portion of the Climbing Skills event be cancelled due to rain-out, the Knot Tying event scores will be substituted for all Climbing Skills scores.]* The same two-person team must perform all areas of the competition. Schools are limited to one two-person team per school.

Pre-Event Qualifying Test: There will be a proctor monitored online test held onsite at NCLC. The testing center will be open Tuesday, March 19 from 10 am – 8 pm and Wednesday, March 20 from 7 am – 7 pm. See the schedule for room assignments. Participants from the same school are to take the test individually but must come to the testing center at the same time. Results will be posted on Wednesday night at 9 pm.

Knowledge Exam (Pre-Event Qualifying Test): All students participating in the arboriculture event will take a general knowledge test. The test will be based on tree biology, safety, climbing, pruning, knots, planting, and other general tree care practices. The test will be a variety of true/false and multiple-choice questions. Tests may vary in length of 25 or 50 questions from year to year.

Students who take the online exam must be the same students who compete in the skills competition. After all tests are scored and the 32 qualifying teams are identified (based on combined test scores of both team members), the climbers will be called forward in order (best compiled scores first) during the Event Briefing on Thursday. Climbers will then sign-up for their time slot for the climbing skills event. Event times may change due to weather conditions and tree evaluations. Students will have a chance to review the test after checking into the climbing skills event.

Climbing Skills: This area of the competition is designed to showcase the climbing skills needed to perform everyday tree care work. Competitors must complete three tasks in the tree and will be scored on their climbing skill and ability. They should arrive with their ground person fifteen minutes early for gear inspection and be ready to climb at the judge's call.

There will be a time limit set by the judge for the completion of these tasks. The time will start when the climber's foot leaves the ground and stops when the climber is on the ground and completely unclipped from their harness. The time **will not** be used as part of the score or to adjust the points earned during the climb. Time is only used as a tiebreaker for this event. A climber that runs out of time and has not finished all of the tasks will receive points earned for the tasks that were completed. Time will be stopped to address a safety issue and will resume once the issue has been cleared. See below for more information regarding the climbing skills portion of the event.

Throw Line Skills: This competition is designed to show the skills required to set a climbing line into a tree. Competitors must use a throw bag and line to hit a crotch in a tree and set a climbing line. See below for more information regarding the throw line skills portion of the event.

Time: Team members will have one hour to complete the online exam.

Limits: If there are more than 32 teams registered, the teams with the lowest combined test scores (both team members) will be excluded from the climbing skills and throw line skills portion.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THE CLIMBER

All climbers will use the same climbing line and will be tied in at the same point.

Climbers may tie their own knots if they wish. Knots must be tied-dressed-set and inspected before use. The judges will tie the knots for those that do not wish to do it themselves.

Approved friction knots for climbing will be: Blake's Hitch, Tautline Hitch, or Schwabisch Prussic.

All climbers may use a personal hand saw and scabbard, if it meets the judge's acceptability stands, otherwise one will be provided to use.

A tree Inspection does not need to be done at the start of your time.

A belay device will be used by all climbers and will be tended by the ground person.

All climbers must be safely tied in at all times during the climb. A lanyard must be attached to the harness and used where required.

All intentional swings must be verbally announced by the climber and acknowledged by a judge.

Slack in a climber's line shall not drop below their ankle. A warning will be issued.

Disqualification may result from any of the following actions:

1. Dropped Equipment: Any dropped equipment or item from the climber or ground person.

1st time, 3 point deduction; 2nd time, 5 point deduction; 3rd time, disqualification.

2. Safety & Misconduct: Safety issues; excessive arguing with a judge; foul language or any other misconduct during event; more than 1 minute late for your event.

1st Violation, Verbal Warning; 2nd Violation, 5 point deduction; 3rd Violation, disqualification.

HAND SAW STATION

The climber must lanyard in and ring the bell with the blade of the hand saw. Hand saw and scabbard will be provided by event sponsor.

POLE PRUNER STATION

The climber must lanyard in and use the head end of a pole pruner to ring the bell. Two hands must be used on the pole. The pole must be re-hung as found by the climber.

LIMB WALK STATION

The climber must walk out a limb and ring a bell with the blade of a handsaw and walk back in again. At no time during this station is the plumb bob hung on the limb allowed to touch the ground. A point deduction will occur for the plumb bob touching the ground.

LIMB TOSS STATION (OPTIONAL - BAD WEATHER)

In the event of inclement weather and the Limb Walk cannot be performed safely we will set a Limb Toss station. The climber must lanyard in near a bucket with two limbs and rings a bell. A target will be set on the ground for the limbs to be tossed into. The climber must give an "All Clear" before tossing a limb. The climber must toss both limbs. The first limb to land in the circle is worth 3 points. The second is worth 2 points. More than half of the limb must land in the target area.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR THE THROW LINE

The ground person from the Climbing Skills competition must complete this skill. The competitor must present themselves and complete the throw line portion at some time during the day. There is not a scheduled time for each team in this portion of the competition. The Climber from Climbing Skills may assist the thrower with managing the lines, and attaching the climbing lines to the throw-line. The climber is only allowed to offer assistance to the thrower and cannot be the integral part of throwing or manipulations of the lines.

Throw line competitors are strongly encouraged to complete their throwing event earlier in the day. Do not wait to late in the afternoon to throw. Do not wait until after your climber has competed, unless they are climbing in the morning. If you are not in another event, complete your throwing event as soon as possible. Throw ball and line will be provided. However, a student may use his or her own throw line and bag. updated 12/03/18

To be scored, the throw line must be through the crotch and below the flagging that marks the target area, and the student must hold both ends of the throw line.

There will be three targets set in the tree. The highest target will be approximately 40 feet from the ground and will not exceed 45 feet. The lowest target will be no lower than 20 feet, if possible.

The student will only be allowed FIVE throws and must declare which target they are attempting before throwing. The throw line can be manipulated into a crotch for a score. The points allotted for the targets will be: highest – 5, middle – 3, lowest – 1.

The thrower must set one climbing line (rope) into any crotch. The rope can only pass through and be set in one crotch. The set rope does not need to be isolated, but the student must be holding both ends of the rope to count as a score. 5 Points will be allotted on only one rope set.

There is a five (5) throws or twelve (12) minute time limit for this event; due to weather or site conditions, the time limit may be adjusted by the event sponsor.

If a throw line gets stuck, the student will receive no points for that throw and may continue with the use of a second throw line. If the second throw line gets stuck by the same competitor, that competitor will be disqualified.

Disqualification may result from any of the following actions:

- Dropped Equipment: Any dropped equipment or item from the ground person**
1st time, 3 point deduction; 2nd time, 5 point deduction; 3rd time, disqualification.
- Safety & Misconduct: getting two lines stuck in the tree; excessive arguing with a judge; foul language or any other misconduct during event; not completing the skill event by the end of the day.**
1st Violation, Verbal Warning; 2nd Violation, 5 point deduction; 3rd Violation, disqualification

JUDGING CRITERIA

Points: 100 possible points per team member; 200 possible points towards the team score; each team member's individual scores will be combined for the team total.

Each team member can earn a possible 50 points for the rope toss and 50 points for the tree climb. The points earned for the rope toss and tree climb will be shared by each team member since only one team member performs each of these skills.

Time will only be used as a tiebreaker.

Students are required to bring the following materials to the event: All gear, equipment and safety items needed for the two skill areas of the competition will be available to use by the Davey Tree Expert Company.

Each individual competitor must provide their own footwear suitable for performing tree care functions. Sturdy boots that cover and support the ankle will be required for both competitors. Soles should provide adequate traction for climbing and ground work (no leather soled shoes will be permitted).

Hard hats and safety glasses must be worn at all times during the skills competition and while in the competition area. Chin straps and eyewear straps are permitted and recommended.

If a competitor wishes to use their own equipment, the competitor must accept the following conditions:

1) All gear will be inspected and approved for use by the judges before the skill competition. Gear will be inspected at the competition site fifteen (15) minutes before the contestant's scheduled time.

2) **All gear and equipment must meet or exceed current ANSI standards applicable to the Tree Care Industry.** All gear shall have a label from the manufacturer stating this fact. The burden of proof lies solely on the competitor. If an item does not meet the standard, or the manufacturer's label is missing, it will not be allowed in the competition. Substitute gear will be available for use by the competitor.

3) **No improvised gear or alterations to gear will be allowed. NO homemade gear or equipment will be allowed.**

4) Rope Snaps must be a self-closing and locking type. Carabiners must be a self-closing and double locking type that require two distinct motions to unlock the gate.

Sponsor is required to supply the following materials for the event:

- All gear and equipment necessary for the tree climb and rope toss
- Rope or tape and stakes to mark off the competition area
- Stopwatches
- Sufficient number of judges and event monitors.
- Any other items deemed necessary for this event
